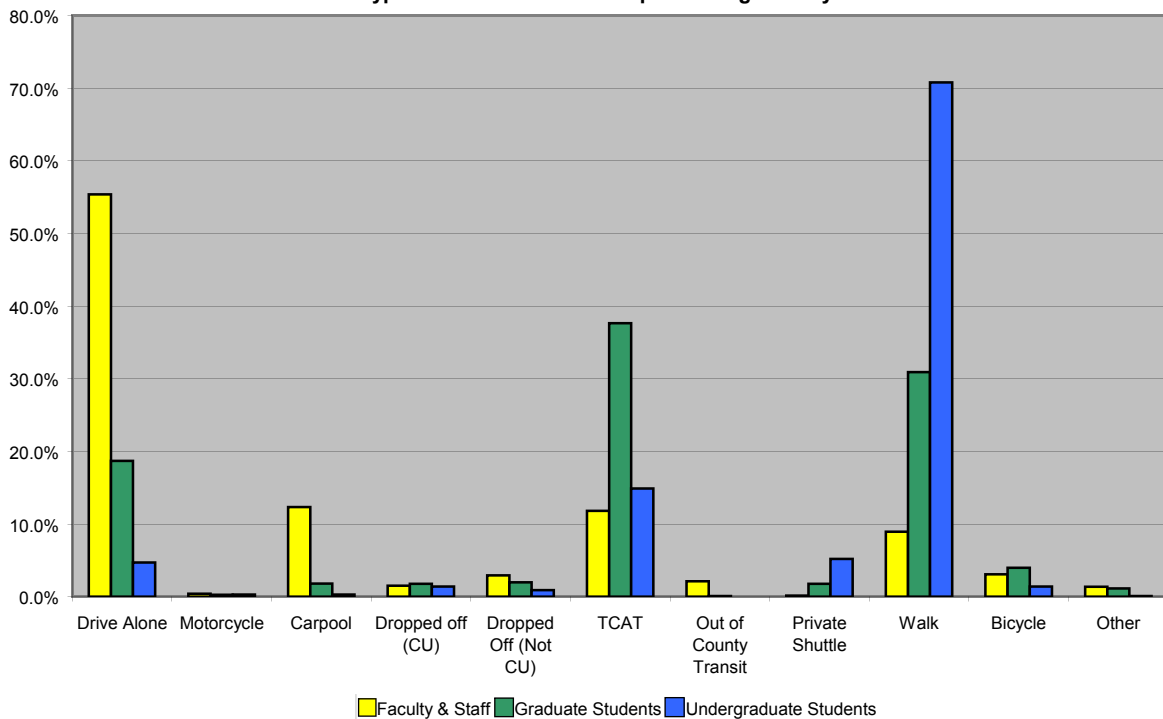


CORNELL TRAVEL SURVEY

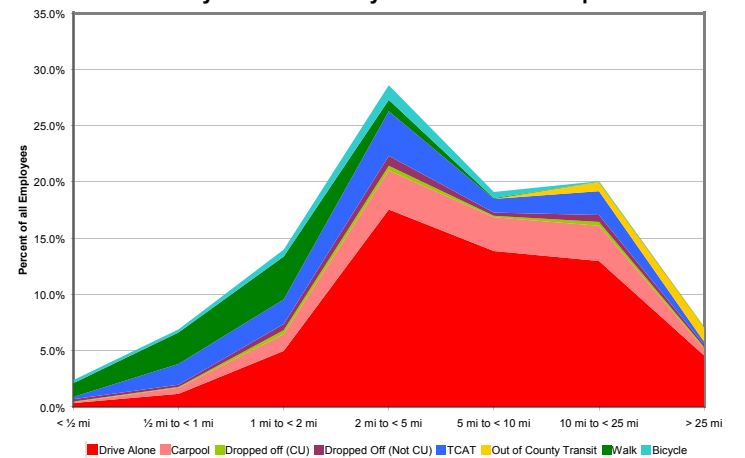
As part of the t-GEIS Cornell conducted a survey of the entire campus community: faculty, staff, undergraduates, and graduate and professional students. The survey served not only to provide a baseline for current travel habits and patterns; it also attempted to gauge the community's interests and preferences for an array of transportation programs and options with the ultimate goal of reducing single-occupancy vehicle trips to and from the Ithaca campus. 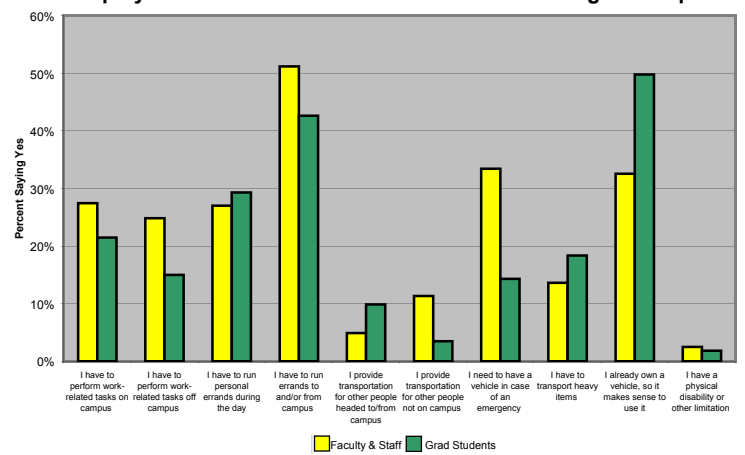
Typical Mode to Reach Campus During the Day



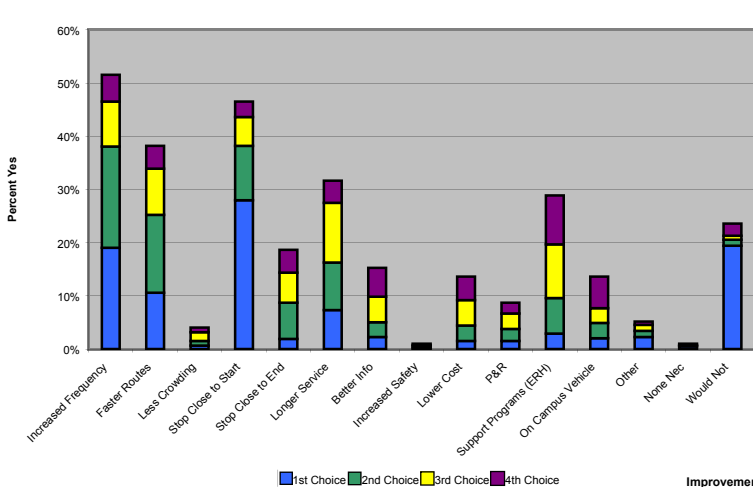
Faculty & Staff Mode by Distance from Campus



Employee & Grad Student Reasons Cited for Driving to Campus

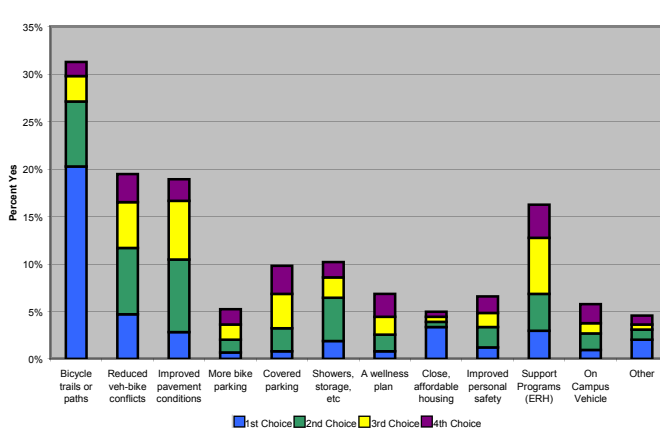


Improvements Necessary to Ride the Bus for Employees Driving Alone
